On October 31, 1517, Martin Luther nailed a list of 95 theses (items to be debated) on the door of the church at Wittenberg. His intent was to reform his church, the Roman Catholic Church.

But, the Church was not ready for the reforms Luther had in mind, and the foundations of today's Lutheran Church were laid.

A Word From the Pastor

What would it be like . . . if we were more than just “church”? What if we did more than just “go through the motions”? What if we were to see ourselves as more than “people who happen to belong to the same church”? What if we saw ourselves as part of the same “family” . . . the family of God? How would we think differently, act differently, live differently with each other? For that is what we are . . . “family”.

The Apostle Paul writes in Romans 12:1-12: *I appeal to you therefore, brothers and sisters, by the mercies of God, to present yourselves as a living sacrifice, holy and acceptable to God, which is your spiritual worship. Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your minds, so that you may discern what is the will of God—what is good and acceptable and perfect.*

So, rather than simply being “members” who “share pews” with one another, we are “siblings”—brothers and sisters—who are a lot more to each other than that. And, knowing that we are siblings, we find that it changes “everything” in the way that we think, act, and live with one another.

There are eight defining marks of the ancient notion of siblinghood that can

apply to how we see each other in the church:

1. The sibling relationship was central in family dynamics, and was usually the longest-lasting relationship a person ever had.
2. Adult siblings provided economic, social, and inter-personal security for each other.
3. Siblings were to express love toward their siblings in every way.
4. Sibling relationships were to be close, trusting, and open.
5. Siblings were to be tolerant and forgiving of each other.
6. Siblings were not to judge each other, and certainly not in public.
7. Siblings were to help the family keep and present a unified front.
8. Siblings were to defend the honor of their family.

So, as we come to church for worship, to learn more about God, to bring our children up in the faith, and to give of our time and financial resources to carry out God’s mission in the church, how does knowing that we are a part of a family change us? Brothers and sisters in Christ, let yourselves be trans-

formed into seeing each other as brothers and sisters. The fact is—we think, act and live differently around people who we feel attached to in some way.

If you are looking to give a tip to a server in a restaurant and you feel that the service was good, you may give an adequate tip. However, if you knew the server personally and knew she was struggling to provide for her family, you may “out of the goodness of your heart” decide to tip more liberally. I believe that the same goes for our giving of our time, talents and financial support of the church. If each of us sees that we are brothers and sisters of one another, sharing in God’s mission in the world through the church, we may “out of the goodness of our hearts” think, act, and live differently, in our giving of our time, talents and financial support to do “our part” to help the “family” out. We are family after all! All that we do we do out of love for one another. It’s what we do. It’s who we are . . . siblings . . . brothers and sisters in Christ.

- **Net August 2014 Operating Income/(Loss): (\$2,633.26)**
August 2014 Gross Operating Income = \$11,340.82
August 2014 Operating Expense = \$13,974.08
- Cash in the checking account as of 8/31/2014 = \$3,362.55
- Current Assets as of 8/31/2014 = \$223,985.98, of which \$220,623.43 is of restricted use. ("Current Assets" total is comprised of checking account, savings account(s), certificates of deposit and restricted funds).
- Balance of Thrivent Loan = \$161,162.32 and is due in 2025. The current monthly payment is \$1,721. Monthly payments are made by electronic withdrawal from a savings account that has a balance as of 8/31/2014 of \$12,865.55

Notes:

1. Giving to the General Fund for the months of July & August is **less than** the same period for last year by \$3,268.51
2. Operating expenses for the same period are **under** budget by \$289.41.
3. Water damage expenses in the narthex and music rooms, as well as repairs to the sanctuary windows, are being met through memorial gifts; **don't let's leave the bills to be paid solely by our dedicated members who have passed away!**
