

A Word From the Pastor

“O give thanks to the Lord, for he is good; his steadfast love endures forever! I thank you that you have answered me and have become my salvation. The stone that the builders rejected has become the chief cornerstone. This is the Lord’s doing; it is marvelous in our eyes. This is the day that the Lord has made; let us rejoice and be glad in it.” (Psalm 118:1,21-24)

Thanksgiving begins with God. Thanksgiving happens as we become aware of our relationship to the one who provides all things for us, and we begin to live our lives in gratitude. It has less to do with fulfilling a law...“doing what we think we should”...and more to do with “living in gratitude with the One who provides all things.”

Last week in confirmation class in the lesson of Jesus feeding the five thousand, we talked about the meaning of two words: scarcity and abundance. Scarcity was defined as “not having enough.” Abundance was defined as

“having more than enough”. I asked the students how they understood each of these words. Right away they thought of poor people living in scarcity and rich people living in abundance. But then I suggested that the difference between scarcity and abundance had more to do with

your thinking than it does with what you actually have.

I said, “If I have an iPhone 4...is that scarcity or abundance? They said abundance. But I countered with... “If I’m not satisfied with my iPhone 4 and would rather have an iPhone 6 like everybody else has... then it is a matter of living in scarcity, rather than abundance.” I’m not satisfied...thankful...for what I have. We live in a consumer culture that has us believing that all things come from hard work and our own doing. This often has us miss the abundance that comes daily from the hands of our Lord.

In order to be truly thankful...we have to

be able to live thankfully. Living thankfully begins by recognizing that all things come from God, our creator, provider, and protector...and living in the mindset of the abundance of all that our Lord has given us. In the words of the Psalmist: “O give thanks to the Lord, for he is good; his steadfast love endures forever!”


The Sunday School offering and birthday money collected this year will go toward buying a cow or chickens, etc., for a family as part of the ELCA Good Gifts program.

All we need to do is to bring our shoes to Trinity, tie them together (or wrap them in a rubber band), and drop them in the *Soles4Souls* drop box in the narthex. **Trinity has donated 327 pairs of shoes so far!!!**



NEIGHBORHOOD CHRISTMAS DINNER SUNDAY, DECEMBER 22

Trinity will again host the Neighborhood Christmas Dinner. This dinner provides many opportunities for all of us to be involved with families in our neighborhood through wrapping of presents, joining in a meal with our neighbors, food preparation, food serving, music and clean-up.

The Neighborhood Dinner is a partnership activity with Midtown Community Center and Pastor Lil. Many of our members have been involved in this project in the past several years. Each and everyone involved felt it was one of the most joyous experiences in which they have been involved.

Please watch for the sign-up sheet starting on November 30. The dinner will be held on Sunday, December 21, with preparation day on Saturday, December 20.

Thank you everyone for your contributions during our monthly Dollar Sunday collection for the dinner. This process provides us with ample money to purchase the food without asking in December for last minute contributions. Planning ahead truly does pay off!

FOOD BANK OUTREACH IN NOVEMBER



Did You Know . . .

- Trinity donated nearly 600 pounds of produce this summer to Mid-Town Family Community Center's food pantry? The entire *Up From the Earth* group of churches together donated 6,000 pounds of produce to various Siouxland food pantries this year.
- On Sunday, September 21, Trinity collected \$72 for the Food Bank's *Loaves and Fishes* campaign?
- For every dollar the Food Bank receives, they can acquire 13 pounds of food through the Feeding America network, which means our \$72 collected in September bought 910 pounds of food?

Trinity's Mission Team has designated NOVEMBER the month of gratitude and thanksgiving. In keeping with Trinity's amazing community mission of feeding the poor, the team is asking our members to donate nonperishable canned goods or boxed goods each Sunday in November. **Most needed items include:** cereals, canned foods such as soup, meats, tuna, fruits and vegetables, peanut butter and jelly, pasta and spaghetti sauce.

There will be a basket at each entrance to the sanctuary designated for your donation. We will collect food only on the first Sunday in November because of the Dollar Sunday collection for our neighborhood dinner in December. The four remaining Sundays we will collect food and/or financial donations. The actual food will be taken directly to Mid-Town Family Community Center to be distributed and any money donated will be given to the Food Bank of Siouxland.

The Food Bank's outreach includes 11 counties in the Siouxland area. Currently, the Food Bank of Siouxland provides food to nearly 125 member agencies, consisting of food pantries, emergency relief agencies, shelters, children's homes, daycare centers, rehabilitation programs, senior citizens centers and other outreach programs. These agencies are spread across our region, including Woodbury, Ida, Monona, Crawford, Plymouth, Cherokee, Sioux and Lyon counties in Iowa; and Dakota, Thurston and Burt counties in Nebraska.

Please prayerfully consider making a food and/or financial donation each Sunday in November. Thank You for your generosity. If you have any questions, please contact one of the Mission Team members.

- **Net Sept. 2014 Operating Income/(Loss): (\$7,249.49)**
Sept. 2014 Gross Operating Income = \$10,606.79
Sept. 2014 Operating Expense = \$18,231.28
- Cash in the checking account as of 9/30/2014 = \$4,065.26
- Current Assets as of 9/30/2014 = \$204,830.76, of which \$200,765.50 is of restricted use. ("Current Assets" total is comprised of checking account, savings account(s), certificates of deposit and restricted funds).
- Balance of Thrivent Loan = \$159,441.32 and is due in 2025. The current monthly payment is \$1,721. Monthly payments are made by electronic withdrawal from a savings account that has a balance as of 9/30/2014 of \$11,105.02.

Notes:

1. Giving to the General Fund for the months of July through September is **less than** the same period for last year by \$4,399.80.
2. Operating expenses for the same period are **over** budget by \$1,689.45.
3. Average monthly giving is **less than** last year by \$1,467.00.


