A Word From the Pastor

"Remember that you are dust and to dust you shall return." These are words that we hear each Ash Wednesday at the beginning of the season of Lent. They remind us of who we are as we come into the presence of Christ in the community of Christ and await the celebration of the Resurrection of our Lord.

In Matthew's gospel, chapter nine, verses 18-26, we hear the two intertwined stories of Jairus, whose daughter has just died and the wealthy leader of the Synagogue pleading for Jesus to come and heal her; and the story of the poor woman suffering from hemorrhages, coming up behind Jesus and touching the hem of his garment that she might be healed. In this story Jesus comes with healing power for all. In the story of the old woman, she was healed as she reached out in faith and touched Jesus' robe. In the story of the young girl, Jesus went to her and took her by the hand, and the girl got up.

Rev. Stephen Bouman writes in his book *The Mission Table*, "The girl was the child of a rich person. The woman who touched Jesus was poor, an out-cast. But their stories connect them to

Every class, race and circumstance are equal at the foot of the cross.

Jesus and to each other, just as in the church people of every class, race, and circumstance are equal at the foot of the cross. Here all are welcome. All are loved. All come for resurrection. We can only rise up as one church together.

"Death makes us all the same. I learned that painfully on September 11, 2001, in New York City as the Twin Towers fell. 'You are dust, and to dust you shall return,' God said (Genesis 3:19). Jesus united the woman and the girl, the poor and the rich at the ground zero of death.

"We, too, are united. We, too, touch the fringe of Jesus' garment every time we gather as the church, hear God's Word, praise God in our worship, share the Eucharist. Then we go from the chancel to the narthex, and then we move forward onto Resurrection Street." (pg. 51-52).

Lent and our walk of the Lenten road together toward Holy Week and the Resurrection, brings us together knowing that we are one in our brokenness, poverty, loss, sickness, pain, struggles, and death. And...we are one as we

seek resurrection, hope, joy, love, and new life. We come as one in our needs. Jesus touches us in our worship, in our coming together, in the Holy Meal...giving us life.

Our midweek Lenten services this year will be around the theme *This Love Changes Everything*. Each midweek service will be a guided prayer time teaching us to come into the presence of our healing Lord and touch the hem of his garment and be touched by this healing presence as he raises us up. There will be a prayer journal booklet that you will receive that will help you to daily connect to our Lord's presence in your own prayer life. The message at each midweek service will be for the purpose of helping us to learn to pray and "be in the presence" of our Resurrected Lord. Come and share in this good news as we begin on Ash Wednesday, February 18, and are marked with the cross of ash, acknowledging our brokenness, and come to the table to experience our Lord's real presence with us. Lent is a time of refreshment and new life. Come join the journey.

FIGHT TOUGH—PRAY HARD CANCER CHALLENGE

Beginning **Sunday, February 1**, and continuing throughout the month of February, Trinity members will have the opportunity to again support the Patient Assistance Program of the June E. Nylen Cancer Center, along with saying some special prayers, during our worship services.



The Mission Team presents a new twist on this challenge for the Sundays in February. This year we are selling cancer awareness **pinwheels** for \$5 each in honor of someone you know, or you yourself, who is fighting or has fought cancer, or in memory of someone who has passed because of cancer. We hope you will put them in a flower pot or a vase, put them outside on your lawn—anywhere you and others can see them to remind you to pray for those dealing with cancer.

Unfortunately, every one of us has been touched by cancer in some way either personally, a loved one, or a friend or neighbor. This is a special way of remembering them or honoring their struggle, and at the same time helping those at the Cancer Center who need assistance with travel expenses, etc., through the Patient Assistance Program.

Last year we raised \$795 and the Council matched that amount. We presented a check to the June E. Nylen Cancer Center in the amount of \$1,590. Our goal this year is to raise \$1,000.

Our Parish Nurses will be available to:

- Draw blood for a Complete Blood Count (CBC) wellness panel, which includes a variety of blood tests, plus testing for liver enzymes, blood sugar, kidney function, cholesterol, etc.
- Check your Blood Pressure

Optional tests for an extra cost will be a TSH (Thyroid Stimulating Hormone) test for \$8/person. Men will have the opportunity to have a PSA (Prostate Screening) test done for only \$13 (tested by blood draw). These tests would cost you \$150+ in your doctor's office. The results of these tests will be sent directly to your home, and you can then share the results with your physician.

Directions to Follow Before Testing:

- 8-12 hour fast
- DO NOT drink alcohol 24 hours before the test.

There will be food and juice for you to eat after your blood has been drawn.

December 2014



- **Net December 2014 Operating Income/(Loss): \$7,364.67**
December 2014 Gross Operating Income = \$25,937.22
December 2014 Operating Expense = \$18,572.55
- Cash in the checking account as of 12/31/2014 = \$27,148.61
- Current Assets as of 12/31/2014 = \$205,231.38, of which \$178,082.77 is of restricted use. ("Current Assets" total is comprised of checking account, savings account(s), certificates of deposit and restricted funds).
- Balance of Thrivent Loan = \$157,366.72 and is due in 2025. The current monthly payment is \$1,721. Monthly payments are made by electronic withdrawal from a savings account that has a balance as of 12/31/2014 of \$11,747.48.

Notes:

1. Giving to the General Fund for the months of July thru December is **less than** the same period for last year by \$172.13. This is an average of \$28.69 **less** per month in General Fund giving.
2. Operating expenses for the same period are **over** budget by \$5,398.03.
