The Season of Epiphany

January 6 is celebrated as Epiphany. Epiphany is the climax of the Advent/Christmas Season and the Twelve Days of Christmas, which are usually counted from the evening of December 25 until the morning of January 6, which is the Twelfth Day.

The term *Epiphany* means *to show* or *to make known* or even *to reveal*. In Western churches, it remembers the coming of the wise men bringing gifts to visit the Christ child, who by so doing *reveal* Jesus to the world as Lord and King.

The colors of Epiphany are usually the colors of Christmas, white and gold, the colors of celebration, newness, and hope that mark the most sacred days of the church year. In traditions that only observe a single day for Epiphany, the colors are often changed after Epiphany to green or thematic sanctuary colors, until Transfiguration Sunday, the last Sunday before the beginning of Lent.

The traditional liturgical symbols of Epiphany are usually associated with the Magi. The symbols include either three crowns or a single crown, various portrayals of the Magi or Wise Men, three gifts, a five pointed star, or a combination of a star and crown. A more modern symbol of Epiphany is a globe or a stylized portrayal of the world.

In traditional Christian churches *Christmas*, as well as *Easter*, is celebrated as a period of time, a season of the church year, rather than just a day. The Season of the Church Year associated with Christmas actually begins with the first Sunday of *Advent*, four Sundays before Christmas Day. Advent is marked by expectation and anticipation in preparing to celebrate the coming of Jesus. *Christmas* begins with Christmas Day, December 25, and lasts for *Twelve Days* until *Epiphany*, January 6, which looks ahead to the mission of the church to the world in light of the Nativity. *The* one or two Sundays between Christmas Day and Epiphany are sometimes called *Christmastide*.

A Word From the Pastor

It's the beginning of a new year! 2015 is past and 2016 is here! This is a time when a lot of us think of New Year's resolutions—things that we are going to let go of and things that we are going to do differently. It is a time to think about the renewal and refreshment that God brings into your life.

In Ephesians 2, Paul writes: "All of us once lived among the ways of the world, in the passions of our flesh, following the desires of flesh and senses, and were by nature

children of wrongfulness, like everyone else. **But God...who is rich in mercy, out of the great love with which he loved us even when we were dead through our trespasses, made us alive together with Christ—by grace you have been saved—and raised us up with him and seated us with him in the heavenly places in Christ Jesus."** (Eph 2:3-6).

Remember your baptism every morning as you splash your face with water.

It is good to *remember your baptism* at the beginning of each New Year! In Holy Baptism, God first claimed you, adopted you as his child and gave you faith. God became a part of your life from that point on...making all things new...every day! Luther thought it a good idea to remember your baptism every morning. As you splashed your face with water, washing your face and awaking to a new day, you can remember that God is going to walk with you every step of that day. You can claim each day with the simple words that were said at your baptism: "Your name, child of God, you have been sealed by the Holy Spirit and marked with

the cross of Christ forever."

And then...listen to God speaking to you: "Do not cling to old ways as you step into a New Year. Instead, see My Face with an open mind, knowing that your journey with Me involves being transformed by the renewing of your mind. As you focus your thoughts on Me, be aware that I am fully attentive to you. I know and under-

stand you completely. Give yourself fully to this adventure of increasing attentiveness to My Presence." (Jesus Calling, Sarah Young, page 2).

Each new day is a gift to you from God. Each Sunday is a time for worship and renewal of your faith, in your time with God and the community that God has prepared for you. As you start this New Year, let your day start with prayer and your week start with worship...in God's name and within the community of faith. May God bless you and your family in 2016!

COMING IN JANUARY . . . FAITH STEPPING STONE 4: MY BIBLE

Trinity will be offering to our 3rd graders and their families the opportunity to participate in Faith Stepping Stone 4. When our youth reach the 3rd grade, they are given a Bible so they can use it as they continue through Sunday School and Confirmation, and, we pray, for the rest of their lives.

Before they receive their Bibles this year, we are inviting them to participate in 8 weekly sessions which will **begin on January 3 and continue through February 21, from 3:30-5:00**. During these 8 weeks, they will actually be using their new Bibles, highlighting Bible verses, etc., and they will be officially presented to them on Sunday, February 28, during the worship services. We will continue this important ministry throughout the year, so please bring your used shoes of all kinds and sizes and drop them in the box in the narthex.
- * **Food Cart** - Please remember to bring nonperishable food items for our Food Cart, which will be donated to Midtown Family Community Center.
- * **Back Door Ministry** - Please donate to this fund when you can. Donations are given to The Micah Project to be used in assisting people with a variety of needs.

UP FROM THE EARTH 2015 REPORT

Up From the Earth, in its second season, continues to grow and is becoming a major contributor of fresh produce into our food pantry system. With a new total of 18 established collection sites, local pantry recipients were offered fresh locally grown fruit and vegetable options which are not usually items received at pantries. It is well known these kinds of foods can contribute to a better diet and better health. Overall, **nearly 19,000 pounds of fresh locally grown fruits and vegetables were harvested and shared locally with those in need.** (Our goal was 10,000!) **JUST OUTSTANDING!!!**

Up From the Earth has had several neat happenings this past season that deserve to be acknowledged. Earlier this year, Leadership Siouxland chose UFTE to be one of their five focused projects. Out of this our current website was developed. They also promoted us through seed packet distribution with our logo and with the activation of Harvest Heroes phone tree communication. UFTE was invited to present our program at the Siouxland Garden Show, and continues to work with ISU Woodbury County Extension and Laurie Taylor to further our efforts. UFTE was invited and spoke at several local garden clubs, churches and service organizations. Through these speaking opportunities connections were made so that some of our fresh produce came from as far as Pierson, LeMars, Homer, Hinton, Sloan and Castana. The level of awareness is spreading!

Another neat event this season was partnering with Siouxland District Health (one of our collection sites) to support their fresh fruit and vegetable prescription program. UFTE, along with Peace Reformed Church and other contributors helped District Health to provide almost 4,000 pounds of fresh produce to allow them to fill some 451 written prescriptions for fresh food items to their patients through three local clinics.

We were featured in U.S. Bank's downtown community display case this fall, and have been invited back for a spring display. Our Facebook page continues to develop. We always appreciate new pictures and script. Contact Jenny Jorgensen to make this happen.

Up From the Earth looks forward to next season as we continue to help feed those in need. We ARE making a difference. And, as always, this cannot be done without your help. **UFTE sincerely thanks all of you so much for all you do!**

Financial Overview
November 2015



- **Net November 2015 Operating Income/(Loss): \$102.15**
 November 2015 Gross Operating Income = \$13,592.50
 November 2015 Operating Expense = \$13,490.35
- Cash in the checking account as of 11/30/2015 = \$4,400.28
- Current Assets as of 11/30/2015 = \$173,216.83, of which \$168,816.55 is of restricted use. ("Current Assets" total is comprised of checking account, savings account(s), certificates of deposit and restricted funds).
- Balance of Thrivent Loan = \$147,551.18 and is due in 2025. The current monthly payment is \$1,721. Monthly payments are made by electronic withdrawal from a savings account that has a balance as of 11/30/2015 of \$7,470.16.

Notes:

1. Giving to the General Fund for the year to date is **more than** the same period for last year by \$16,570.93. This represents \$1,657.09 a month more in General Fund giving.
2. Operating expenses for the same period are **under** budget by \$1,080.95, and **under** last year by \$2,702.32.
