The **Day of Pentecost** is celebrated exactly 50 days after Passover, or seven weeks after Easter.

The Pentecost Season is the longest season of the church year, lasting the entire second half of the church year until the first Sunday of Advent.

In the Christian church year, Pentecost celebrates the day the Holy Spirit was given to the followers of Jesus, so that they had the power and courage to preach the good news (see Luke 24:48-49; Acts 2). This is why Pentecost is sometimes called the birthday of the Christian church.

The **color of the Day of Pentecost is RED** for the fire of the Holy Spirit and for the blood of brave Christians who gave their lives because of their faith. The color of the Season of Pentecost is green for growth.

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A Word From the Pastor

Jesus is risen! He is risen indeed! As we move from Easter and its message to Pentecost and the coming of the Holy Spirit, we have to look at the church and ask: "What does it mean to live the Christian life?" What difference does our faith make in our daily lives?

It has to do with *what's broken in our lives, where we have been hurt, where we have sinned and our lives have become unmanageable*. When that happens, Christ comes in the power of the Holy Spirit to bring us new life. It's when we come to recognize where we are broken and lost that we really come to realize our need of God in our lives. One writer has said, *"I never want to be the kind of Christian who portrays themselves as perfect. I have flaws and I have struggles; that's why I need Jesus."*

This was Christ's gift to us from the beginning. It defines who we are as God's children in the world. In the 24th chapter of Luke, right before Jesus ascended into heaven he said, *"Thus it is written, that the Messiah is to suffer and to rise from the dead on the third day, and that repentance and forgiveness of sins is to be proclaimed in his name to all nations,*

beginning from Jerusalem. You are witnesses of these things. And see, I am sending upon you what my Father promised; so stay here in the city until you have been clothed with power from on high." Luke 24:46-49).

At Pentecost that gift of the Holy Spirit and the power to bring God's good news to everyone was given to us. *Forgiveness and Renewal* are at the heart of that good news. It is the one thing that is missing in all of our lives. It is the one thing that Christ brings us through the healing power of the Holy Spirit to share with one another.

Rev. Delmer Chilton writes in the latest *Living Lutheran*:

"Christianity is not a private or personal religion, not really; it is a faith that must be lived out in community. Dr. Paul Tournier, a Swiss Christian psychiatrist, has said, "There are two things we cannot do alone. One is to be married; the

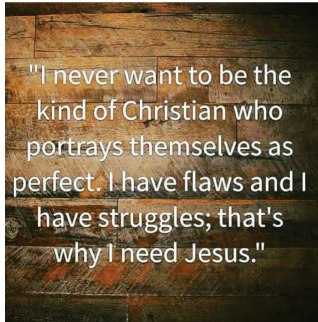
other is to be a Christian." This is why, as much as we can respect the spiritual and emotional honesty of those who say that they are "spiritual, but not religious," we must encourage them to become a part of a community of faith.

"For we all need the church in order to be Christian, if for no other reason than we cannot love and learn to be loved alone. It is within the daily bump and grind of living and working together as the people of God that we find out what it means to be forgiven for our failures, praised

for our efforts, appreciated for our virtues, prayed for in our sorrows, helped in the midst of our troubles, and loved in spite of ourselves. We need each other in order to practice our faith and to be a truly Christian people." (from April 25, 2016 *Living Lutheran*).

Trinity Lutheran Church is called to be that people with one another, with our neighbors and to the world. Thanks be to God.

- **Net March 2016 Operating Income/(Loss): (\$7,898.65)**
March 2016 Gross Operating Income = \$13,471.47
March 2016 Operating Expense = \$21,887.12
- Cash in the checking account as of 3/31/2016 = \$5,331.48
- Current Assets as of 3/31/2016 = \$142,683.99, of which \$137,352.51 is of restricted use. ("Current Assets" total is comprised of checking account, savings account(s), certificates of deposit and restricted funds).
- Balance of Thrivent Loan = \$163,158.74 and is due in 2025. The current monthly payment is \$1,721. Monthly payments are made by electronic withdrawal from a savings account that has a balance as of 3/31/2016 of \$10,018.00.

Notes:

1. Giving to the General Fund for the last year to date is more than the same period for last year by \$204.12.
2. Operating expenses for the same period are over budget by \$538.62, and over last year by \$352.32

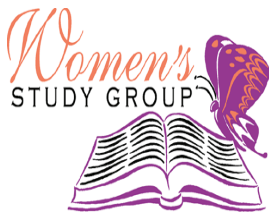


Women's Fellowship

JOIN US THIS SUMMER FOR A STUDY ON THE BOOK OF GALATIANS

Wednesday Evenings at 5:30

June 15, 22, 29 & July 13 & 20

We're trying something a little different this summer . . . our own Bible Study leader, Patty Den Beste, will be taking us through Paul's letter to the Galatians, which is the most radical book in the New Testament. No need to order books and very little homework, but get ready to dig deep into Galatians. Just bring your Bible and a pen or pencil, as a lesson sheet will be provided each week. The homework will consist of reading a chapter in Galatians for the next week. There are only 6 chapters so that shouldn't be too difficult!

This four-session course explores Galatians through four key questions:

1. *What Happens to People Pleasers?* What's at stake when we focus on people-pleasing? We will start to examine how we deal with all the expectations that individuals and institutions have of us, and how we can never meet them all. We will see God's solution to this most human of problems.
2. *Is There One, and Only One, Gospel (Good Message)?* There are many religions and denominations but can there be more than one gospel, more than one "good news" from a God who loves us?
3. *So . . . What About God's Rules Now?* Why did God send the law? What do we do with it now? If Christ frees us of this law, then what do we do with all the rules, including the Ten Commandments? Are we still obligated to follow them?
4. *How Do We Live by the Spirit?* If we are no longer obligated to follow the law, what is left over? Paul shows us what the remaining two choices are and how we are to live by them.

On June 15, we will kick off our 5-week study with a light supper and introduction to the book of Galatians. Come with your Bibles and an appetite, and prepare to be fed, physically and spiritually, as we dive into Galatians in a *devotional, historical, literary and Lutheran context*.
