January 6 is celebrated as Epiphany. Epiphany is the climax of the Advent/Christmas Season and the Twelve Days of Christmas, which are usually counted from the evening of December 25 until the morning of January 6, which is the Twelfth Day. This year Epiphany falls on a Sunday, January 6.

In traditional Christian churches *Christmas*, as well as *Easter*, is celebrated as a period of time, a season of the church year, rather than just a day. *Christmas* begins with Christmas Day, December 25, and lasts for *Twelve Days* until *Epiphany*, January 6, which looks ahead to the mission of the church to the world in light of the Nativity.

### A MESSAGE FROM OUR COUNCIL PRESIDENT

As we embrace New Year 2019, it is helpful to recall the many blessings of year 2018. The Trinity family has an extremely sound foundation as evidenced by our diversity, vitality, and genuine acceptance of each other. God's strong hand has strengthened and cradled us through a year that unfolded in a much different manner than expected.

At the beginning of 2018, we knew that Pastor Paul would be retiring at the year's end. We also knew we would be celebrating his many years of ministry, as well as celebrating the 100<sup>th</sup> birthday of our beautiful building. What we didn't know was the May 11 tragedy of our beloved member Jim Jensen's death. With the love of his church in mind, he supported Trinity's ministry with funds that were designated for other uses. Upon his passing, we learned that most of our funds were diverted to pay operating expenses. The reality of Trinity's existence was certainly tested during the following months ... the outpouring of financial and moral support was incredible. In a very strange way, Trinity has been bolstered by these very unfortunate circumstances.

Our Sunday morning attendance has been very steady and even growing with new faces every Sunday. And Trinity activities aren't just for Sundays, but all week long, as our members stream in to prepare the sacristy for communion, stuff the newsletter, attend and/or teach Confirmation and the Wednesday youth group, join in for choir and bell choir practice, decorate the church, paint and repair, prepare and cook for Saturday morning men's group and the Christmas dinners, plus all of the other meals and ministries Trinity provides. Members also visit and bring communion to our shut-ins and to others in need or who are hospitalized.

As we anticipate 2019, we feel blessed for the many gifts Pastor Paul has shared with Trinity. His ministry showed us how to believe in ourselves—to not only dream but to also put those dreams into action. Our congregation is as strong as it has ever been. We are not a membership of like-minded individuals, but rather a membership that welcomes all and celebrates our uniqueness. As one member voiced, "we are a quirky congregation!". How wonderful!

Considering Trinity's unique financial position and Pastor Paul's December 31, 2018 retirement, the 2019 approved budget provides a road map to gaining financial strength and stability while also providing for: 1) congregational care, 2) vibrant worship experiences, and 3) mission awareness and outreach.

During January – March (and possibly April) this will be accomplished by:

- 1) Temporary Ministries Coordinator Patty DenBeste who will be responsible for:
  - a. member contact, visitation, and administering communion to the shut-ins
  - b. member involvement in worship and various aspects of TLC ministries
  - c. worship planning and Sunday worship support
- 2) Administrative Assistant Jane Olorundami will help Ministries Coordinator with:
  - a. member contact, visitation, and administering communion to the shut-ins
  - b. member involvement in TLC ministries
  - c. worship planning
- 3) Sunday Supply Pastor
  - a. Pastor Dave will be responsible for opening church each Sunday morning
  - b. Pastor Dave will preach two times per month and will be available for funerals and baptisms
- 4) Sunday Services
  - a. Lay people will preach the other two Sundays per month
  - b. Lay people will help with service liturgy.

The Call Committee, comprised of Rob Bailey, Patrick Beyer, Owen Burrack (youth representative), Christy Clark, John DenBeste, Shirley Luebke, Skip Meisner, Kerry Patterson, and Jim Sorvaag, has begun the initial phases of their task. This dynamic group will be involving all of us as they develop the Trinity Lutheran profile. Please continue to keep the Call Committee and their search in your prayers.

During this transition year, it is **extremely important** that we join the Trinity family on Sunday mornings as we worship together to strengthen our faith and to support each other in our various journeys. We all remember the children's hand story of "here's the church, here's the steeple, open the door and see all the people" —We are so much more than a church and steeple—We are God's people!

A heartfelt THANK YOU to each of you for the incredible ways you brighten our 100-year-old building!

On December 9, our Sunday School youth presented *Christmas from Scratch* during our 11:00 worship service.



**The Mission Committee has been very busy working on several projects:**

- \* **Soles for Souls** is a very productive project. Our congregation has donated 1,521 pairs of shoes to the organization to be refurbished and distributed to people in need. Thanks to Jeri and Russ Snyder for transporting the shoes.
- \* **Food Cart** - Please remember to bring nonperishable food items for our Food Cart, which will be donated to Midtown Family Community Center.
- \* **Back Door Ministry** - Please donate to this fund when you can. Donations are given to The Micah Project to be used in assisting people with a variety of needs.

**November Attendance/Offerings**

- \* Balance in our checking account on 11/30/19 was \$66,740.70.
- \* Of that amount, \$54,609.23 is "Without Donor Restrictions"
- \* \$12,131.47 is the balance in the accounts "With Donor Restrictions" (Overall Funds received since May 11, 2018 for designated or specific restrictions minus expenses).
- \* Our Baird account balance is \$34,362.05 (\$25,000 for Dible Endowment and \$9,362.05 for Building Maintenance).
- \* Trinity received General Operating Income and In-Kind Income for the month of November in the amount of \$14,781.55, with Operating Expenses for the month totaling \$15,841.21 for a **net operating loss** of 1,059.66 in November.
- \* We also received \$7,683.00 in Donations With Restrictions and expended \$4,697.80 from these Restricted funds in November.
