SERMON on the MOUNT LENTEN SERIES

Join our Trinity family on Sunday mornings and Wednesday evenings as we journey through the season of Lent, which begins with Ash Wednesday on March 6.

Our series theme for Lent takes us through the most familiar teachings of Jesus from his Sermon on the Mount in Matthew 5-7 and relates them to the events surrounding Christ's life, death and resurrection. In the process, the services will powerfully reveal that the cross itself is the ultimate sermon on the mount for our journey of faith in this sacred season.

There will also be a Sermon on the Mount devotional for your family and the adult study and Sunday School in-between services will follow our Lenten theme.

Join us as we journey with Jesus to the cross and his glorious resurrection!

March 6 - Ash Wednesday @ 4:30 & 7:00

BLESSED Are YOU - We who are poor in spirit, who mourn and who hunger and thirst for righteousness are called blessed by our Savior in his Sermon on the Mount. Ash Wednesday reminds us that though we have been brought low by sin, our Lord will bless us with new life in him through the cross.

Week 1 - Sunday, March 10 & Wednesday, March 13

SALT and LIGHT - Christ calls us to be salt and light in this world of sin. We who have tasted and seen his great love for us on the cross can spend our Lent savoring his salvation and shining with his glory and grace in the places where he has put us.

Week 2 - Sunday, March 17 & Wednesday, March 20

PRAYER and FASTING - Lent is a season of prayer and fasting. We grow in our relationship with Christ by communicating with him, and we learn more about him and ourselves by giving up those things that can distract us from our connection to him.

Week 3 - Sunday, March 24 & Wednesday, March 27

DO NOT WORRY - So much of our lives, even in Lent, is spent worrying about what might happen or what has happened. Christ teaches us to stop being anxious, but simply to trust that he knows what is best and will take care of us to the very end.

Week 4 - Sunday, March 31 & Wednesday, April 3

JUDGE NOT - We live in a very judgmental world, so Jesus' advice not to judge sounds radical to our modern ears. When we leave all judgment up to God, we free ourselves to look at one another through fresh and forgiving eyes.

Week 5 - Sunday, April 7 & Wednesday, April 10

BUILD on ROCK - We build our lives on very shaky foundations, and then we are surprised when things start collapsing. Jesus reminds us in his teachings that the only solid foundation is himself, the Rock of our salvation. On him alone we build.

Their first task is to fill out the Ministry Site Profile (MSP) for our congregation. They filled out their section of the Profile, and now they are asking you, our members, to fill out the Congregational Survey, which was emailed and passed out last Sunday.

Due to the weather conditions last Sunday, we know there were many who didn't receive the survey if they cannot go online. No worries—there will be Surveys available for the next couple weeks. Please fill out and return either online or in the box in the narthex before Sunday, March 3. The Call Committee will then compile your information and complete the MSP.

They hope to submit the completed MSP to the Synod Office by May, which then goes out to the ELCA synods letting them know Trinity is looking for a Pastor.

Please keep our Call Committee in your prayers, and continue to pray that our new Pastor will hear God's call.

Why Ashes?

- Ashes are a reminder of the shortness of human life.
- Ashes are a symbol of our need to repent, confess our sins, and return to God.

(Ancient people used ashes to make soap.)

We receive the ashes on our foreheads in the sign of the cross, the same symbol we receive at our baptism. In life and in death, we are "marked with the cross of Christ forever".

After we receive the ashes, we will take time to confess our sin and hear the declaration of grace that washes us clean.

It's not too early to make plans for Camp this summer.

Lutheran Lakeside Camp offers a variety of camping opportunities for our youth from 1st grade thru High School. Family camps are offered throughout the year also.

Camp brochures/registration forms have been handed out to the Confirmation youth, and there will be a few in the narthex for our younger youth to pick up to check out the camping opportunities this summer.

The cost for each person to go to most of the camps is \$460 (\$410 if registered by March 1). Trinity's policy is to sponsor Confirmation students who are going for the first time at half of the early discount amount (\$205) and \$100 toward each other young person going. There is also a \$15 sibling discount.

All registrations can be made on their website, www.LutheranLakeside.com, and if you have any questions about registration, please give their office a call at 712-336-2109. Our congregation will have a sponsorship code because we pay for partial tuition, so please call Jane in the church office (258-0519) for that code before you go online to register.

Sending our young people to camp is probably one of the best things we can do to help them grow their faith as it connects to their life. If we are to continue to see this as a mission to our own young people, we will need to start funding it through special gifts every year. Please consider this in your giving to the church when special offerings are taken.

- * **Food Cart** - Please remember to bring nonperishable food items for our Food Cart, which will be donated to Midtown Family Community Center.
- * **Hy-Vee Receipts** - The box to collect Hy-Vee receipts is out on the table in the narthex. **The receipts can be collected through April 30, 2019.** Any receipts that you have collected over the summer months or earlier in the year will not be accepted.
- * **WARMING SHELTER**, located at 916 Nebraska Street, is a temporary emergency shelter during the winter months for those who are homeless. Trinity is aware of their need for food and other supplies and has started a fund for these needs. If you would like to donate to The Warming Shelter, you can mark your donation as such and you will be given credit on your envelope number. BLESSING BAG MISSION PROJECT

The Blessing Bags are available in the narthex for anyone who would like to take one to have available to give when you see someone in need. There are bags marked for women or men.

We had enough donated items to make 50 bags, and our youth filled the bags during Youth Group.

The Church Office will keep some of the bags on hand to give to those who come to the back door, and the remaining bags will be taken to the Warming Shelter.

THE WARMING SHELTER

Since opening December 2013, to date the Warming Shelter, located at 916 Nebraska Street, provided over 53,000 nights of shelter. We have an average of 80 men, women and children per evening. The 2016-2017 season we have added 25 more bunks, which brings our capacity to 116. During last season alone we have had several people transition into permanent housing. To our knowledge, no one died of overnight exposure during the 5 winters we have been open. All are very appreciative of your willingness to help them.

We have no administrative staff, so 100% of every dollar goes to serve the homeless. Furthermore, we take no funds from tax-supported entities, but rather rely on donations from generous givers. Your donation helps ensure that no person in Siouxland is forced to sleep outside during the winter months.

Financial Overview
January 2019

Thank you for your ongoing support of Trinity and its mission. Our Finance Committee has been meeting monthly to fully understand and monitor our financial situation. As you know, we passed the 2019 Budget which included no expense for an interim Pastor during the first three months. Pastor Dave Carlson, Supply Pastor, Patty DenBeste, Temporary Ministries Coordinator, and Jane Olorundami, Administrative Assistant, have been coordinating efforts to continue our meaningful services and activities in order to keep our expenses lower. We also want to make sure that you have the information you need as we walk through this journey together; therefore, we will provide you monthly with updates on our financial position.

January 2019:

- *Balance in Checking Account:* \$73,786.47; of that amount, \$18,332.51 is for Designations/Restricted Accounts (Designations received since 5/11/18=\$53,626.04, Designations used since 5/11/18=\$35,293.53); therefore, \$55,453.96 is unrestricted.
- *Investment Account:* As of 1/31/19, the designated balance is \$34,859.15 for the Dible Endowment and Building Maintenance funds.
- *Building Loan balance:* \$102,207.67, due in 2025.
- For the month of January, offerings were less than what we paid out in expenses:
 - Received Income totaling \$17,752.51.
 - Paid Expenses totaling \$18,028.82.
 - Therefore, we had a **net loss** of \$276.31.
 - In addition, we paid our Loan principal amount, which then shows a total **net decrease in our net assets** of \$1,447.31 in January.





ACCORDIAN MEMORY BOOK PROJECT


Thursday, April 4 @ 6:00 p.m.
